Yetty's Coffee Shop launched

The first weekend in May saw the launch of Yetton Together's new venture - Yetty's Coffee Shop.

Homemade cakes, scones and fresh coffee were some of the things on offer in the Community Centre on Fields Rise.

After an initial slow start on Friday afternoon, the place livened up considerably on Saturday with over two dozen customers.

Yetton Together's Chair Trish Mellor, said 'It's an encouraging start. Many people have been asking for a community cafe for such a long time. The idea of the initiative is to create a space in the centre of the village where people can meet for a chat, socialise and even play dominoes or other board games. We are

starting small but with the village's support we will be able to expand in the future.'

The coffee shop, manned by volunteers, will initially be open on the first Friday of the month between 2:30 and 4:30pm and the following Saturday 10:30 - 12:30. Board games are available at the Friday sessions. The next sessions will be on Friday 4th and Saturday 5th July.

Yetton Together is also providing refreshments in the library every Thursday and Friday from 2:30 - 4:30pm.

All profits will be used to support keeping the library and Community Centre open.

social media. Our hard work
resulted in a small, yet lovely
group: a mixture of teenagers,
younger children and some
dedicated local volunteers,
collectively aged 8-80 years
of age. It was an amazing
(and unplanned!) opportunity

to do some fantastic inter
generational creative work.

Our week of activities was
hosted at Kirkheaton Library
but incorporated the whole
village, as we took to the
streets to gain our inspirations.
We took photographs,
collected stories and used our
imaginations to fill in the rest.
The result was “Quirkheaton”,
a unique walking trail of the
village which incorporated
stories (both real and
imagined!) that were told by
residents themselves and
shared on a brilliantly sunny
Friday afternoon in February.

We received wonderful

all eager for similar work to
happen in the future and I'm

Taxi office planning application granted on appeal

Although the planning application for change of use of 5 Heaton Moor Road from a food takeaway [Pizza Verona] to taxi office, was rejected by Kirklees in February, the decision was recently overturned by the Planning Inspectorate on appeal.

Permission is granted with the following conditions:

1. The development shall begin no later than three years from the date of this decision.
2. No more than six private hire vehicles shall operate from the address.
3. No customers shall be picked up or dropped off from the address.
4. The use shall not commence until space has been laid out for 2 cars to be parked as per application and the spaces shall not be used for any other purpose.

Laneside Landfill Site Update

At April's Laneside Landfill meeting, points covered by the operator's report included:

- The project is well behind schedule and an extension will probably be sought
- Domestic waste tipping is due to start on completion of gas & water monitoring – probably Spring 2015
- There will be no changes to the approved footpaths unless land reinstatement make it necessary

- Restoration work around the edge of the site is continuing
- A cut-off ditch around the western and northern boundaries will be in place during 2014
- Removal of existing woodlands (as per planning permission) will take place during the next 4-5 years
- A permit to treat and drain leachate into the sewage system has been obtained.
- On completion public access will only be permitted on designated footpaths and bridle ways
- Any permissive paths outside the boundary of the quarry will have to be negotiated with local land owners

Library Chatter

Nine volunteers have attended induction sessions over the last few weeks at Kirkheaton Library. 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Landscape project at Whitley Beaumont

The “Follies of Youth” is a project run by Pavilion, an arts organisation based at Leeds University. The project is supported by YT and will involve arts graduates working with artists and the community on the ‘lost landscape’ designed by Lancelot ‘Capability’ Brown [1716-1783] at Whitley Beaumont.

Dr Redmonds, a local historian, has agreed to speak to community groups about the history of the site before works starts in July.

Research will be undertaken on and off the site during the summer and preparations will include photography workshops. It is hoped local young people from the Kirkheaton and Lepton areas will become involved.

An artwork based on the Whitley Beaumont landscape will be produced by participants led by a professional artist.

The completed project will be presented to the public at a special event in September.

As requested by Yetton Together, Kirklees have now provided Kirkheaton with a village sign at the junction of School Lane and Crossley Lane. A semi-circular flower bed has also been dug out by the Council which our Gardening Club has planted up with recycled plants and bulbs from the roundabout (which is being cleared for summer planting) along with poppy seeds as part of the WW1 commemoration.



ENVIRONMENT UPDATE

To complement the extra 20 hanging baskets which the 200 Club membership helps to support, eight new self watering half barrel planters have been funded by Kirkburton Parish Council [plants funded by YT]. These have been placed on approved sites around the village, so look out for them or better still volunteer to help maintain them.

Community Orchard – Whilst the May blossom promised fruit later in the year, it unfortunately attracted the attention of persons unknown who have broken several trees and others have just vanished, including the support stakes. This area has also suffered from irresponsible dog owners collecting their dog waste and then throwing the bags into the trees and bushes at the side. The dog warden has been informed - please report any inappropriate behaviour via our website.

YT volunteers along with five employees of McDonald's cleared much of the rubbish from the slopes of the Tandem Industrial Estate during their March litter pick. Further clearance will now have to wait until the Autumn when the vegetation has died down.

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Art Festival 2014

'It's lovely you're back' - a comment from one of the visitors to this year's Kirkheaton Art Festival. The Festival returned, bigger and better than ever, after it's break last year, with nearly 50 local artists exhibiting and live music. In spite of the poor weather over the Spring Bank Holiday around 500 people attended, from as far away as Holmfirth and Bingley.



A first this year was a Friday evening Preview event which showcased a number of local young musicians and an author and was a great success. "The Festival continues to expand," says Rector the Revd Richard Steel. "Encouraging young artists was very much a theme this year with two young people, just 17 and 20, exhibiting for the first time - and they both sold things, which was great.

Another highlight was an embroidered owl that was so realistic some people thought it was stuffed!"

Alongside the usual mix of photography, painting, quilts and embroidery there was jewellery and some excellent wood-turning, and the usual high-quality refreshments, all completely free. Almondbury Choir 'Raised Voices' and the Kirkheaton Singers performed. There were visits to the Bell Tower and a number of people expressed interest in learning to ring.

A belated thank you* to all who kindly donated their Examiner Wish Tokens to Yetton Together - all 18,234 of them! A magnificent total of £272.52 was raised which has been used to buy a heavy duty strimmer to keep the community orchard tidy. 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Putting faces to Kirkheaton's WW1 memorial

To commemorate the start of World War One, the Kirkheaton Family History Group is staging an exhibition in the parish church commencing on the 4 August 2014 for four weeks. In preparation for the exhibition the names on the Kirkheaton Parish Memorial in the church are being researched. This memorial was dedicated on 17 July 1921 and cost about 300 guineas (£12,493 at today's prices). The money was raised by subscription and the 104 names on the Memorial were provided by "local knowledge". Further research, including the Kirklees Military Memorial Survey, has increased the number of names to 130. (Visit yettontogogether.org/world-war-1-commemorations/)



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A striking feature is the short length of time from enlistment to being killed on the battlefield - on average only six weeks. All levels of society from the rich to the poor experienced the tragic consequences of war. Members of both the Tolson and Ainley family (who established Kirkheaton Mills) lost sons alongside workers from the area.

A story which was not unusual is that of Lewis Hill. As a miner he was prevented from enlisting locally so he travelled to Ashby de la Zouch in Leicestershire and enlisted under his mother's maiden name of Lee. Lewis subsequently died as a prisoner of war. His half brother and cousin also died in the conflict.

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CHANGING KIRKHEATON

These photos of the top of Orchard Road were taken over 80 years apart. Around 1910 the area was known as Charlie Hill and was the site of Queen Victoria's Golden Jubilee fountain erected in 1897. The coloured photo shows the area in the eighties. By then the fountain has gone and mill garages erected. The site has changed yet again over the last few years – the garages have been demolished and the hut like bus shelter replaced.
