"The buzz is amazing" someone said as they entered our Home from Home Friendship session at the Community Centre recently, "it really is a happy place". And that's our aim! The group provides a safe, friendly, happy and homely place for people living with dementia, their carers and for those who are lonely or isolated to come and meet others.

Since our launch the numbers attending have increased session by session and we are enjoying getting to know people individually, as each person has a different reason for coming. At each session there are memory boxes, books and games to help stimulate conversation and a lot of good chatter over coffee and cake. In November we decorated our room for Remembrance Day and sang to war time songs, with everyone wearing their poppies and waving a Union Flag. December's was Christmas themed and so we had bubbly (non alcoholic), mince pies and cake along with a quiz, carol singing and everyone went home with a present from Santa. The room was awash with happy smiling faces and laughter. They didn't seem to want to go home!

Each coming month we intend to have an appropriate event at one of the sessions and something more easygoing at the other such as a table quiz, short talks, with our usual memorabilia available. Future plans for events include representation from different dementia teams, speakers from a variety of groups and a couple of play productions. Of course, there's always tea, coffee, cake and conversation.

We are a non profitable organisation and are very grateful to our various sources for providing funding.

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Kirkheaton Youth FC revised plans after COVID setbacks

We started to raise funds several years ago with the aim of having our own purpose-built pavilion on our field. During 2019 we were placed on the Football Association development path for funding as a priority club. However, we were expected to raise further funding before they would commit to any financial support. Plans were approved for the project and we intended on 2020 being the year we raised

costs, delays on materials, and funding requirements from the FA. It became clear that a pavilion meeting FA requirements was going to cost significantly more than the club could currently commit to and would take years rather than months to deliver.

We have instead purchased a bespoke kitchen and toilet unit based on a container to match our initial needs. This will provide the club with good basic facilities that will leave some funds for improving the site.



the remaining funds required before the FA would provide the 75% funding. Unfortunately, due to COVID fund raising was impossible and 2021 also got off to a slow start with spectators required to keep away from the pitches. This affected our income with our usual kitchen income and raffles diminished. With the lease on the kitchen and changing rooms coming to an end in August 2021 and the lease company demanding higher rental costs and not allowing us to purchase the units we made the decision to have them removed and reconsidered our options.

We reviewed the pavilion project, considered increases in building & labour

We are planning for groundwork to start in April to include fencing and hedging to our boundary on Bankfield Lane along with improved paved areas and planting, and also ensure the facilities are flood resistant.

The facility is a modular design, so we can add more elements if required in the future.

We are working towards the next development with the possibility of a 4G pitch which would facilitate winter training and save £1000's each season. It is thanks to our parents, guardians, and the support of the community that the club is self-sufficient and now has a facility to keep moving forward.

A Swift Solution

If you've ever seen the Red Arrows, you'll remember the exhilaration you felt from the team's spectacular aerial display - man and machine in perfect harmony. There's a bird that can give you that same thrill. In May, swifts will be flying here from Africa. In summer, they can often be seen displaying in the fields around Kirkheaton and Gawthorpe, and dipping into the ponds around the quarry. Their flight is not only spectacular but their whole way of life is spectacular. They eat, drink, mate and sleep on the wing, landing only to breed and feed their chicks.

But not for much longer because the swift is now on the threatened species Red List, having declined by 58% in the last 50 years. Since Roman times, swifts have nested in buildings but our propensity for demolishing and 'improving' old buildings has destroyed nesting sites. In addition, our over-use of insecticides has reduced insect population, in turn reducing their food source.

The situation has become desperate but we can do something to help. We can give the birds a ready-made home by simply erecting a nest box under our eaves or, if we're doing building work, we can insert 'swift bricks' which provide nesting sites built into the wall.

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PAUL HOLIDAY STANCLIFFE

(1816-1862) PORTRAIT ARTIST

Whilst researching Job Hirst who was born in Kirkheaton and contractor for building the Ribbleshead Viaduct, I came across correspondence in the Yorkshire Post, dated 19th September 1932. It was from Job Hirst's son who was seeking information about another Yettoner, Paul Stancliffe, who he understood, had painted his father's portrait in 1848 in celebration of his feat in building the viaduct.

This led me into looking into Paul Stancliffe's life.

Paul Holiday Stancliffe was born May 1816 in Kirkheaton and baptised 3rd June, the son of James Stancliffe (clothier) and Elizabeth (nee Holiday). He attended school in Kirkheaton and in 1841 he was recorded as a schoolmaster (living at Shop Lane on his own).

By 1851 he is recorded as an artist, unmarried and still at Shop Lane Kirkheaton. Three years earlier he painted a miniature portrait of Job Hirst master mason and railway contractor who later supervised building of the famous Ribbleshead viaduct. The two were most likely to have attended school together.

In 1854 Paul married Maria Leggott at Leeds and the couple moved to Newtown, Huddersfield. He continued the profession of portrait artist and by 1861 had also embraced photography at Burrows Yard, Newtown.

The 1861 census records Paul Stancliffe 44 -Portrait painter and photo artist, Maria Stancliffe 38, born Doncaster and Rosa Stancliffe 5, born Leeds, living there.

However their marriage was short lived since Paul died in 1862 at the early age of 46 and was interred at Kirkheaton cemetery on 14th March.

A detailed history of Job Hirst and his many claims to fame will be the subject of a talk at the Community Centre later this year.

Community Centre building celebrates 140 years of service to Kirkheaton

This year the Community Centre on Fields Rise celebrates 140 years since its foundation stone was laid in October 1882 by Lord Dartmouth on land donated by local mill owner, Hefford Ainley. It started life as an infant school with 70 children on role. This increased over the years to over 200 in 1972! Since 1982 when the school closed, it has housed a play school, youth club, library and more recently has become a Community Centre serving the whole village and beyond.

The local history group is working with Yetton Together to hold an exhibition to commemorate its history. Can you help? For this event we are collecting photographs and stories. Did you, or anyone you know, attend the school, go to the Monday night youth club, have a party or

The surgery is extremely busy, but we continue to provide services to our patients without interruption as well as continuing to support the ongoing COVID vaccination campaign.

We will continue to remain extremely cautious and we kindly request that our patients continue to wear a mask when entering the surgery, unless exempt from doing so. We have unfortunately had a number of COVID infections across the team, but thanks to the great work ethic of everyone, we have ensured that there has been limited impact on the delivery of service and ongoing care to our patients. We also thank our patients for their patience and ongoing consideration for the team. Your support is appreciated.

We continue to operate a telephone triage consultation with a face-to-face appointment being offered where it is deemed clinically necessary, with an increase in face-to-face appointments taking place on a day-to-day basis.

The current Practice Manager is due to leave the Practice at the end of February 2022 and a replacement Manager is being recruited. We are still looking to recruit a salaried doctor into the Practice, meanwhile we will continue to work with our regular locum doctors to ensure continuity of care. We have three new receptionists: Carly Sergeant and Kirsty Longley who joined us in Nov 2021 and Khanya Khoza who joined us in February.

The next surgery closures for Practice Protected Time (PPT) are 15th March, 2022 and 19th April 2022.

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20% for Wildlife Update

Clare Walters writes:

Our group now has 103 members which means we will be having a real impact on our local wildlife! Please join us on our facebook group: 'Kirkheaton 20% for Wildlife Project' for lots of ideas to encourage wildlife into your garden.

We had to cancel our Halloween workshop due to the weather but moved the winter workshop indoors to the Community Centre where 20 people joined a wreath making session and around 30 children got involved with making fat balls to hang out for hungry birds. This will encourage them to notice their winter visitors and hopefully get involved with the RSPB's winter bird count (www.RSPB.org.uk).

In February we will be hosting a swift and house martin nest box project. These birds used to be common in our village but have declined dramatically partly

because of a loss of available nest sites. There are still small colonies on St John's Road and New Road so we will be approaching residents asking them if we can erect nest boxes for them to try and boost numbers.

Then in March we will be sharing wildflower seeds again so that everyone can grow a little patch in a large plant pot or a corner of their garden for the bees and butterflies – look out for yours at CostCutter.

Finally in May we will have a bat box making workshop and a dusk bat walk to see what we have flying around our village. Please keep an eye out on the 20% for Wildlife page, the Yetton website and Kirkheaton Matters for more details nearer the time.
